Details: This narrative is for incidents 03007198 FA-Gun and 03007199 Home Invasion I.

I, Officer Killingbeck, responded to 19157 Inkster rd. on a report of a Home Invasion/Felonious assault that had just occurred.

Upon arrival I spoke with the complainant Richard Nedeau, and his girlfriend Michelle Bailey. Richard states he was sitting at his kitchen table eating with his girlfriend when he heard a vehicle drive across his neighbors lawn and onto his lawn. Richard states he heard the door to the vehicle slam. Seconds later Richard states he observed suspect Robert Mayles enter his residence through the front door.

Richard states Mayles "crashed threw his front door" yelling loudly "where the fuck is she." Richard states Mayles entered his residence and walked through the family room into his bedroom. Richard states Mayles walked through his bedroom into the kitchen and back to his front door. Richard states he confronted Mayles and asked him what he was talking about. Richard states Mayles yelled at him "I know you have her here where the fuck is she." Richard states he asked Mayles who he was looking for. Mayles stated "A.J." Richard states he told Mayles he didn't know what he was talking about.

Richard states at this time Mayles unzipped the front of his carhart jacket, reached into his waste band and removed a nickel-plated handgun. Richard states he took a step back and put his hands up. Witness Michelle Bailey was standing directly behind Richard at this time. Richard states Mayles pointed the handgun directly at his face and stated, "tell me where she is or I'll kill you." Richard states Mayles moved the gun back and forth, pointing it at Michelle's head then back at his head.

Richard states he told Mayles he didn't know where "A.J." was. Richard states he said "go ahead and kill me you crazy bastard, you'll be dead before the sun comes up." Richard states at this time Mayles turn around and walked out of the residence. Richard states Mayles entered a black pick-up truck and sped off south on Inkster rd.

I spoke with witness/complainant Michelle Bailey. Bailey's account of the incident matched Richards statements. Bailey states that Mayles did point the handgun directly at her face several times during the incident. Bailey states Mayles also threatened to kill her. Bailey states she feared for her life and thought she was going to die.

Richard states he does know "A.J." and states she is a woman that Mayles has been living with. Richard states that Mayles is a heroin addict and has been supplying "A.J." with heroin. Richard states on Friday 3/7/03 "A.J." showed up at his residence asking for \$100. Richard states he gave "A.J." \$100 cash and she left. Richard states a few hours after giving "A.J." the cash Mayles called him and yelled at him for giving "A.J." the money. Richard states that's the last time he saw "A.J." (Richard states he doesn't know A.J. by any other name).

L62 Sgt. Moug, L39 P.O. Pertovitch, L34 P.O. Davis and I sat up on Mayles residence at 18803 Inkster. Mayles lives approximately ¼ mile south of the complainant's residence. Sgt. Moug made telephone contact with Mayles. Mayles denied being at Richards's residence tonight and informed Sgt. Moug that he had been home all night. At first Mayles refused to exit his residence to talk to officers. Sgt. Moug was able to get Mayles to exit his residence and talk with officers over his backyard fence.

Mayles was uncooperative while talking to officers. It appeared that Mayles might attempt to flee back into his residence. Believing that Mayles had committed a Home Invasion and Felonious assault I approached Mayles and grabbed him by his jacket and held him to the fence giving Sgt. Moug and P.O. Davis time to gain control of Mayles. I informed Mayles that he was under arrest and handcuffed him behind his back. Mayles was secured and transported to LPD jail without further incident.

After handcuffing Mayles I stated "where's the gun" Mayles immediately stated "its in the house." Then stated, "wait a minute, what gun, what are you talking about."

Once at LPD the case was turned over to the detective bureau. Officers did not attempt to enter Mayles residence because he has two very large dogs preventing entry.

DETAILS OF INVESTIGATION

On 3/11/3 at approx 2140 hrs. Complainant Richard Nedeau and Michelle Bailey were in the Nedeau residence at 19157 Inkster, Livonia, MI. The two were in the kitchen having a meal. Nedeau heard a vehicle drive across the neighbor's lawn and onto his lawn. Once the vehicle stopped Nedeau heard the vehicle door slam and seconds later the defendant entered the house through the front door. The storm door was locked and the entry door was unlocked. The storm door was forced open by pulling on it. No damage to the door.

Once inside the house the defendant ran thru the house yelling for "A.J.", yelling "where the fuck is she?" After going thru the house, the defendant approached the two in the kitchen and yelled at them; "I know you have her here where the fuck is she?" At this time Nedeau tells the defendant that "A.J." was not at the residence. ("A.J." is a common friend of both men).

At this time Mayles unzipped the front of his jacket and produced a silver, with dark grips, auto hand gun from his belt. The defendant pointed the gun at Nedeau and Bailey who was standing behind Nedeau. The gun was pointed at their faces and the defendant was yelling: "Tell me where she is or ill kill you." The gun was being pointed back and forth at each or their faces. Nedeau stated that he did not know where "A.J." was and the defendant left the residence and entered his black PU truck and drove away.

The comp Nedeau knows the defendant from prior contacts and common friends. The defendant did not have permission to enter the residence.

Nedeau called the Livonia Police and made complaint # 03007198. Sgt. Moug, P.O. Petrovitch, P.O. Davis and P.O. Killingbeck went to the defendant's residence. Sgt. Moug called him on the phone and had the defendant come out of the house to talk about the incident. The defendant exited the residence and was arrested for the B&E and FA that occurred at 19157 Inkster. The defendant was transported to the station and booked.

3/12/3 at approx. 0740 Hrs. Sgt List conducted a post Miranda interview with the defendant. During this time the defendant denied going to the house but stated he did call the house and was looking for "A.J." When asked who "A.J." was the defendant stated that she is Alissa Beveridge and she was living with him but moved out during the day. That is why he was looking for her. Sgt. List asked the defendant where the gun was located. The defendant stated that he has a gun on his computer desk, in the living room, and that it was loaded. The defendant stated that he was having heroin withdraws.

Sgt. List signed as an affiant on a search warrant on the defendant's residence at 18803 Inkster Rd. During this time a TACICAL, S&W, 9mm, Auto, loaded was recovered in the living room, on the computer desk. This gun is silver in color with black grips.

The black, Ford, F150, PU, 0962FC, was parked in the driveway of the defendant's residence. The same type vehicle the comp saw the defendant drive away from his residence after the incident.

1 **SOURCE:** DISPATCHED RUN/B&E, HOME INVASION.

2 **INFORMATION:** I WAS DISPATCHED TO [REDACTED] FOR A B&E IN PROGRESS. DISPATCH
3 ADVISED BY RADIO THAT THE SUBJECTS WERE INSIDE OF THE HOUSE AND NOW WERE
4 ATTEMPTING TO LEAVE THE SCENE. DISPATCH ADVISED IT WAS 2 BLACK MALES AND THE
5 HOME OWNER WAS FOLLOWING THEM ON FOOT.

6 WHEN I TURNED WESTBOUND ON BROWN FROM LAPEER RD. I OBSERVED 2 BLACK
7 MALES AND A WHITE MALE STANDING ON THE NORTH SHOULDER OF BROWN RD. THE
8 WHITE MALE WAS POINTING TOWARDS THE 2 BLACK MALES. I PARKED MY PATROL VEHICLE
9 ON THE ROADWAY AND ORDERED THE 2 BLACK MALES TO THE GROUND. THE 2 SUBJECTS
10 COMPLIED. I KEPT THE SUBJECTS ON THE GROUND UNTIL UNIT 1514 DEP SUMMERS ARRIVED.

11 THE SUBJECTS WERE THEN TAKEN INTO CUSTODY, SEARCHED AND PLACED IN
12 SEPARATE PATROL UNITS.

13 I SPOKE TO THE COMPLAINANT/HOMEOWNER RAYMOND ROCHELEAU, W/M, 12-28-56.
14 RAYMOND STATED THAT HIM AND HIS WIFE PULLED UP TO GET THE ^{MAIL} ~~MAIL~~ AND SAW A VAN
15 PARKED IN THE DRIVEWAY. RAYMOND STATED HE THOUGHT THAT IT MIGHT BE HIS SON OR
16 ONE OF HIS FRIENDS. RAYMOND SAID WHEN HE LOOKED IN THE VAN HE REALIZED THAT IT
17 WAS NOT ANYONE HE KNEW. RAYMOND STATED THAT WHEN HE LEFT THE HOUSE HE
18 CLOSED THE DOOR AND HAD USED A BOARD TO SECURE THE DOOR. RAYMOND SAID WHEN
19 HE WALKED TO THE DOOR HE SAW THE DOOR WAS OPEN AND HE WENT INTO THE HOUSE TO
20 SEE IF SOMEONE WAS INSIDE. RAYMOND SAID HE SAW 2 BLACK MALES WALKING THRU HIS
21 KITCHEN CARRYING TOOLS THAT HE KEEPS IN THE BASEMENT. RAYMOND SAID HE SAW THE
22 BLACK MALE IN THE FRONT DROP THE TOOLS TO THE GROUND, THEN HEARD THE SECOND
23 BLACK MALE DROP WHAT HE WAS CARRYING.

24 RAYMOND SAID HE WAS LEAVING TO CALL 911 AND THE 2 BLACK MALES FOLLOWED
25 HIM AND TOLD RAYMOND THAT IF HE DID NOT CALL 911 THEY WOULD HELP HIM GET HIS
26 STUFF BACK. RAYMOND SAID HE HAD BEEN BROKEN INTO SEVERAL TIMES IN THE LAST 6
27 MONTHS.

1 **Supplement to Report # 06-803:** I arrived at the intersection of Brown and Lapeer roads
 2 and saw 2 black men being detained by Deputy Huston and a white male standing about 25 feet
 3 to the east. I assisted Deputy Huston by handcuffing and searching one of the detained men.
 4 Deputy Timko searched and handcuffed the other. I placed the individual in Deputy Huston's
 5 police car.

6 **Interview with Raymond Paul Rocheleau:** I then made contact with the white male who
 7 identified himself as Raymond Paul Rocheleau and stated that he and his wife had pulled up the
 8 drive way and saw a van in his driveway. He approached the van thinking it was one of his
 9 son's friends and realized that it was not. He walked up to the house and saw the back door was
 10 open. Raymond grabbed a shovel and entered the house. As he walked in he could hear people
 11 on the basement stairs. He went into the kitchen and saw two black males (Gary Williams and
 12 Louis Smith) standing at the top of his stairs holding armfuls of his tools. The men dropped the
 13 tools on the floor and Raymond backed out of the house. Then Williams and Smith followed
 14 him outside pleading with him not to call the police and stated that if he did not call the police
 15 they would help him recover some property of his that was stolen in the past. Raymond walked
 16 down his driveway onto Brown road and was followed by Williams and Smith. That is when
 17 Deputy Huston arrived. Raymond stated that he recognized the men as he had sold them auto
 18 parts in the past. Raymond stated that his back door was secured by a piece of wood that was
 19 placed there through a missing panel in the door.

21 Deputy Richardson and I then checked the home to see if anybody else was in the home and
 22 there was not. I then had Raymond walk me through what had happened. I then took
 23 possession of the tools that Smith and Williams had carried upstairs. I drove to the Orion
 24 substation and then transported Smith to OCJL and then I placed all the stolen tools in into
 25 evidence (See Property Sheets for inventory.)
